Saarah's hard work during this very busy crucial time of our farming year has been a massive help.

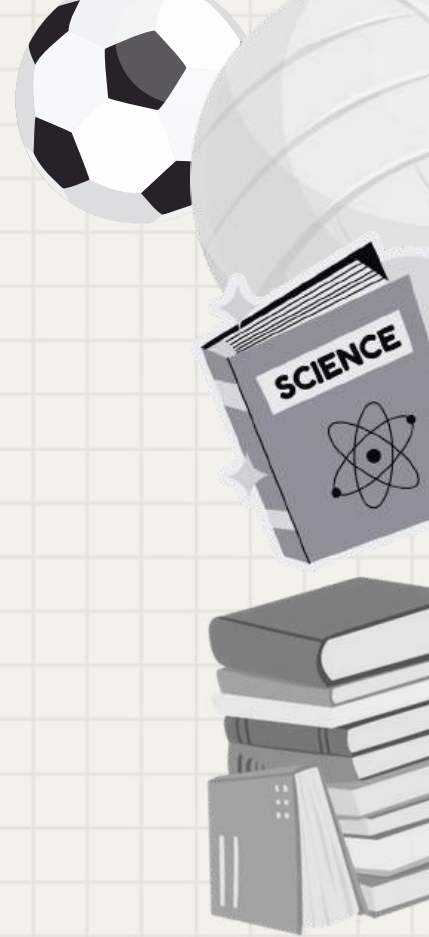
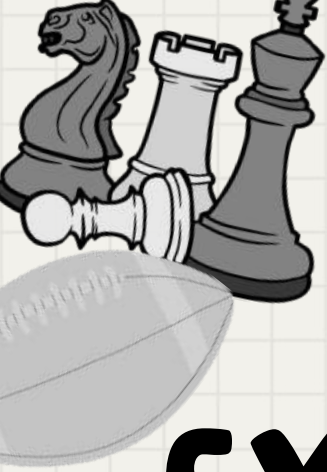
Daily tasks

Saarah also successfully competes in lots of agricultural competitions including Stock judging, live and carcass, public speaking, tug of war and some creative classes.

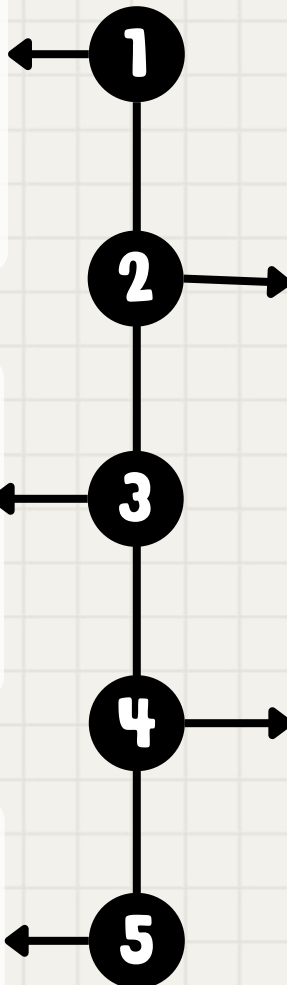

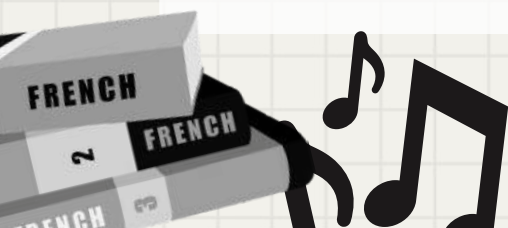

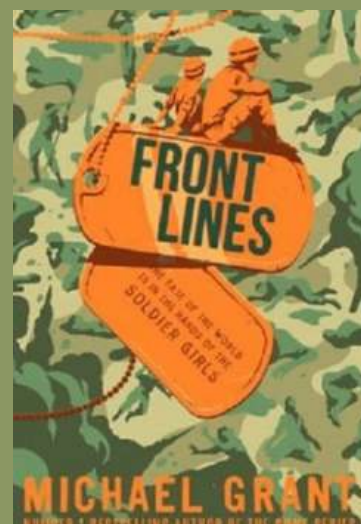


YEARS 9 AND 10

La fete du travail - 1er mai

"La fête du travail" translates to Labour Day in English.

It is celebrated annually on May 1st and is a public holiday in France dedicated to workers' rights. The celebration often featuring parades and the tradition of giving lily of the valley flowers (muguet) to friends, family or colleagues as a symbol of luck. It is also known as International Workers' Day or May Day. May 1st is the only day in France where individuals are allowed to sell, without a license, wild Lily of the Valley on the street, often found in small, fragrant bunches.

Demonstrations are also a common sight when unions organize marches and rallies in towns and cities to protest, celebrate rights, and advocate for social change.

It is a strict holiday; most shops, banks, schools, and offices are closed, with exceptions for vital services like hospitals and transport.

Year 8 are working hard not only learning the events linked to the rise of democracy, but looking at sources and considering why these changes were so important and how they shape us as a nation today.

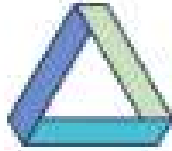

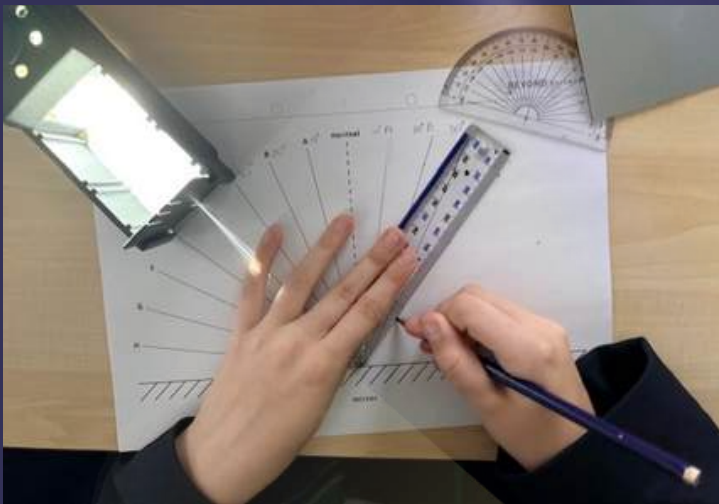

SCIENCE



This week, Year 8 students are diving into the fundamentals of optics by exploring how light behaves when it hits a surface. The core of their learning revolves around the Law of Reflection, which states that the angle of incidence is always equal to the angle of reflection.

Students are practicing how to measure these angles using a protractor, starting from the normal—an imaginary line drawn perpendicular to the reflective surface. By using ray boxes and mirrors in the lab, they are seeing firsthand how light "bounces" predictably, a principle that explains everything from how we see ourselves in a mirror to how periscopes work.

Suspect a scam message?

Slow down
Think it through
Overcheck
Pass it by someone you trust

General signs of a scam are:

- If It's too good to be true, then it probably is!
- Act now! - pressure or urgency to share details
- An unfamiliar company or logo
- Unusual URL links e.g.bit/inst123
- Misspelt words

3 Steps to protect your personal information

Organisations who help victims

- Your bank (they never ask you to share passwords or one-time passcodes)
- Your mobile phone provider
- 'Report Fraud' is the website for reporting all fraud to the police
- Cifas (offers a Protective Registration for victims of fraud for a fee)
- Victim Support

Use a strong password
Short phrase or three random words. Mix letters, characters and numbers

2

Use different passwords
Fraudsters try using stolen passwords across different accounts.

3

Set up multi factor authentication
Secure accounts with biometrics and a passcode sent via an email or text

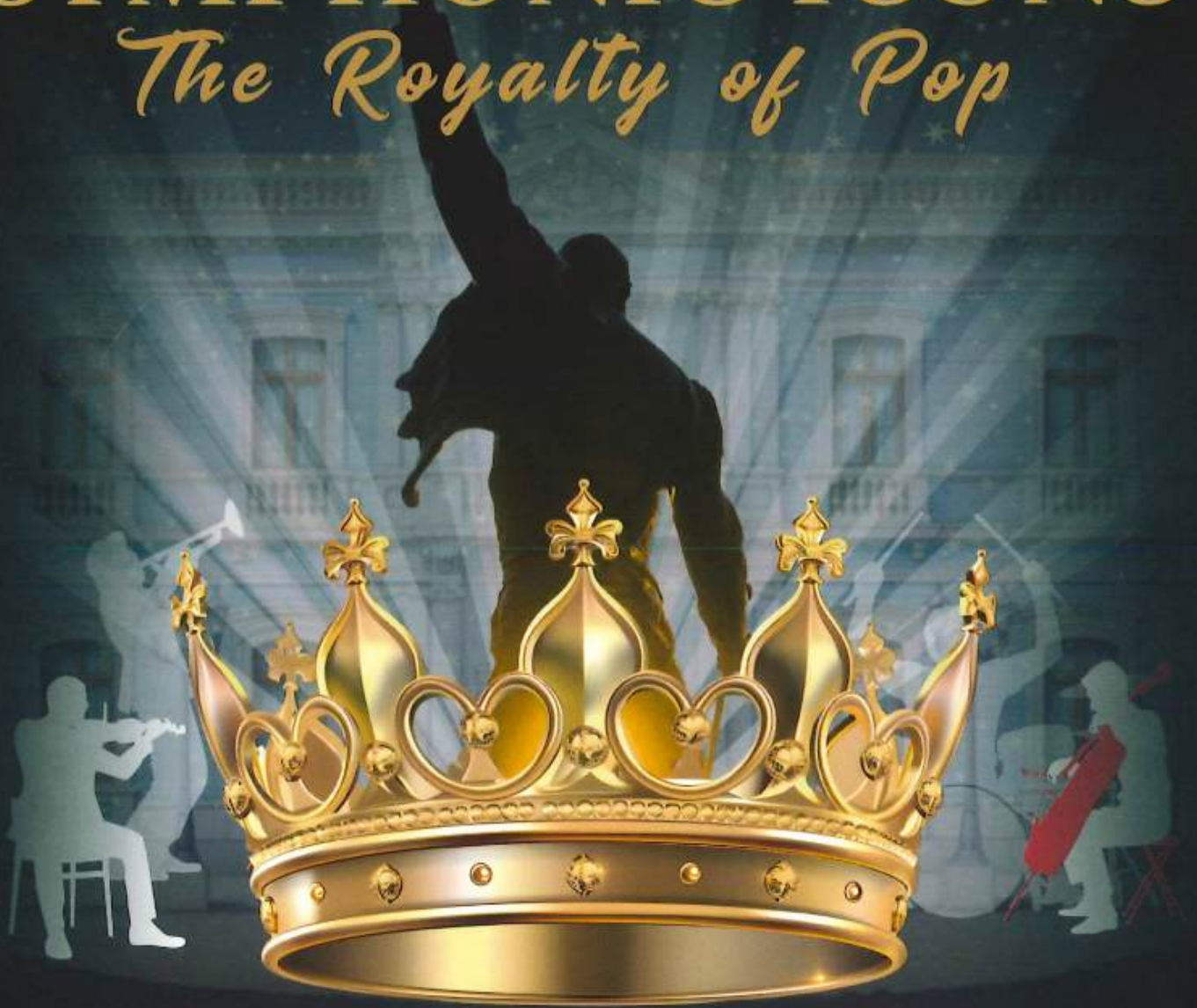

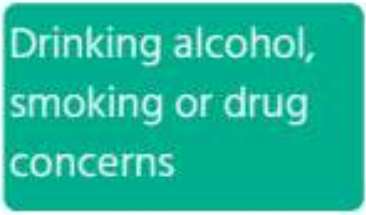
